The College's Careers and Employability Strategy captures our ambition and commitment to providing all students, whether they be, Academic, Technical, Apprenticeships, Higher Education or Adults, with the very best learning experience which equips students with the ability to secure their future career pathway. High quality Careers Education Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) is fundamental to the success and sustained employment choices for our students, therefore, our Strategy is aligned to industry standards and expectations which focus on the lived experience of students.

Through our Careers Programme, we will provide opportunities for high quality careers guidance and employability education throughout an individual's time as a Blackburn College student. Support Services

Blackburn College invests in having professional, on-site support services to make curriculum learning accessible and enhance the wider learning experience. Through the provision of targeted support for individual needs, we make sure that all students have the best chances of success.

Careers and Welfare Team, Pastoral Support Team, Work Placement Team, Academic Coaches, HE Disability Advice Service and the Access and Participation Officer.

SEND Support

Our dedicated SEND Transitions Co-ordinator provides further support for those students with SEND, attending career reviews to ensure that students are advised about careers and progression activities, in preparation for their next steps and adulthood.

Parents and Carers

Parents and Carers play a crucial role in ensuring young people are set up for a successful career, future financial security and a good quality of life. We encourage Parents and Carers to work with us and be actively involved in their young person's decision making and learning.
