Welcome from the Chair of the Corporation Board

Welcome to Blackburn College's Annual Report for the 2020/2021 academic year on behalf of the College's Corporation Board.

Whilst COVID-19 is still bringing new challenges to the world and significantly, within the education sector, we should be delighted with the way we have been able to make a successful return to inperson study and work. However, it is important that we remain aware and cautious about the virus and ensure that we are able to continue to work and learn in a safe and secure environment.

Even with the pandemic affecting students' study and education during the 2020/21 academic year, I am proud to report that the College has celebrated an increase in A-Level A*, A and B Grades with an overall BTEC Pass Rate of 99.7%. Our apprenticeship results also mean that we are the top College in Lancashire for apprenticeships.

Similarily, it was fantastic to be able to attend our 2020 and 2021 Graduation and watch our students celebrate their wonderful achievements. 2020 graduates have had to wait an extra year for their ceremony and with both sets of graduates having to work through the pandemic to achieve their results, they were richly deserving of their Graduation and able to celebrate their success with their peers at King George's Hall.

We have seen students start and complete the application process for applying to study at the University of Cambridge and the University of Oxford. Our new OxNet scheme will see more Blackburn College students progress to study to Oxbridge and Russell Group universities.

Now that we have a larger understanding of the COVID-19 pandemic and the challenges this brings to Blackburn College, we are able to react and adapt to changing circumstances and Government guidelines to ensure that students and staff are able to continue working in a safe environment.

Through dedication, resilience and teamwork, we have been able to provide the best all-round education for our students. This is done to prepare them with the knowledge, confidence and skills they need to embark on a successful career in this everchanging world.



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Welcome from the Principal and Chief Executive

As we reflect on the academic year 2020/2021, Blackburn College can be proud of how it has overcome the challenges posed with returning to study after the COVID-19 lockdown.

We have had to adapt and prepare for a return to campus for both staff and students and ensure that we all remain safe whilst on campus. It has been really pleasing to see staff and students follow the changing government guidance and come together to do what we can to stay safe.

Even with all of the challenges and adaptations students and staff had to make, Blackburn College achieved outstanding results with an overall 91% Achievement Rate across all Further Education courses, a 100% Pass Rate in many A-Level subjects and an overall 99.7% A-Level Pass Rate for the 2020/21 academic year; this included an increase in A* grades and an 8.6% increase in A grades.

This success means that students have progressed to top universities across the country such as Lancaster University, the University of Leeds and UCLan.

Last year, we saw the redevelopment of Blackburn Sixth Form which demonstrates our commitment to invest in our 16-18-year-old provision, to ensure our students have access to the highest quality Further Education, and facilities in a safe and secure environment. Blackburn Sixth Form is a place of high achievement, with a recently launched programme that will help A-Level students secure places at top universities including Oxford, Cambridge and other Russell Group universities.

Next year we hope to welcome even more students into our Blackburn College family.

Earlier in the year, Blackburn
College was awarded a grant as
part of the Further Education
Capital Transformation Fund
which will help us to redevelop our
iconic Victoria Building.

The investment will help us to completely re-develop the Victoria Building as project to ensure the building and facilities support the skills needs of the local labour market and can contribute to local economic regeneration and the levelling-up of skills.

I commend this Annual Report to you and look forward to sharing successes with you in future years.

About Blackburn College

Blackburn College is the largest Further Education College in Pennine Lancashire and one of the larger providers of Higher Education for a College in England. Since 1888, people from all over Lancashire and beyond have developed their skills, retrained and moved to higher levels of study with Blackburn College's support.



Blackburn College is at the heart of the multi-racial community of Blackburn with Darwen and aims to provide social cohesion in an area of high deprivation. The College works with a range of local partnerships to contribute to the wider prosperity and regeneration of Pennine Lancashire.

The majority of students and Apprentices are from the most economically deprived local areas. Around a third of students and Apprentices are of minority ethnic heritage and almost two thirds of Further Education students enrol at the College without having achieved five GCSEs at grades 9 - 4 (A* - C), including English and Mathematics. Blackburn with Darwen is a 'Prevent' priority area and 14% of the local population have no qualifications. Millions of pounds have been invested in our world class, town centre campus which was developed collaboratively with employers and stakeholders to help future proof our curriculum and ensure our students are taught in industrystandard facilities.

We have successfully fostered excellent relationships with local and regional partners and employers. This results in a curriculum that meets local and regional needs and provides high quality work experience for students and Apprentices. We deliver specialist, bespoke training as well as Apprenticeships, Traineeships and Professional Qualifications, all of which equip the workforce with job relevant skills that match the current employment market.

Blackburn University Centre also provides Higher Education to students, including Foundation Degrees, Honours Degrees and Higher Level Apprenticeships. Our employer engagement supports employability through enhancements to curriculum development, mentoring placements, volunteering opportunities and industry specialist speakers.

The College is a founder member of HIVE — the Blackburn with Darwen Business Leaders' Network. HIVE has already become an integral part of the area's Local Strategic Partnership, which brings together leading figures from the private, public and third sectors and is Blackburn and Darwen's largest partnership body. The College has also been a key partner in the Blackburn Business Improvement District (BID) in recent years, supporting many local improvements.



News Roundup 2020/21



Increases in A-Level High Grades and outstanding BTEC results at Blackburn College

Students and staff at Blackburn College celebrated as students collected their A-Level and BTEC Results with the numbers of Blackburn College students achieving high grades continuing to improve.

Blackburn College students achieved a 100% A-Level pass rate in science subjects including Maths, Further Maths, Biology, Physics and in other popular A-Level student choices including Accounting, Law and Psychology.

Meanwhile the College celebrated that 41.4% of A-Levels are graded A* to B in a year when students have had to contend with periods of home and remote learning due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Blackburn College's success means students are set to progress to top universities across the country including Lancaster University, The University of Manchester, and the University of Leeds as well as students choosing to study locally at the College's own University Centre.

The 2020/21 student cohort are progressing to a range of subject areas including: Civil Engineering, Maths and Physics, Pharmacy and more. Some students are also progressing to Degree Apprenticeships.



The College officially opened its £1m redeveloped Sixth Form to coincide with Colleges Week.

The ribbon was cut on the new Blackburn Sixth Form by Chair of the Corporation Board Lillian Croston alongside Dr Fazal Dad, Principal and Chief Executive.

Guests including College governors, staff and students, along with members of local schools and industry partners, attended the event to mark the start of national Colleges Week.

Blackburn Sixth Form is home to 300 A-Level students studying a wide range of A-Level courses along with students studying on a range of complementary vocational qualifications. The opening of the new centre coincides with the numbers of A-Level students doubling compared to 2020/21 enrolments.

The redevelopment of the former St Paul's Centre has seen the creation of new social spaces, drop-off facilities, and study areas and an expansion of the number of purpose-built classrooms. It is also home to scientific laboratories, a student hub, computing suites and a café.



National Success for Blackburn College Students

Two Blackburn College students were successful in the national BTEC Awards.

Myles Campbell, 18, and Declan Rigby, 17, both scooped podium finishes in the Sport and Engineering categories respectively. The awards ceremony was held online and broadcast on YouTube in July.

Clitheroe resident Myles Campbell's hard-work and dedication was recognised with a silver award in the BTEC Sports Learner of the Year category. Myles was praised for his positive attitude towards the practical elements of his Level 3 BTEC Sport course and how he embraced his work experience.

Meanwhile, former Walton-le-Dale High School pupil Declan, was recognised in the Engineering Student of the Year category. Declan returned to Blackburn College in September to complete the second year of his Engineering Extended Diploma.

Blackburn College is the driving force behind new £1.3m renewable energy motor vehicle project

The college is leading the Lancashire Automotive Skills Accelerator Project funded by the Department for Education, as part of The Skills Accelerator Strategic Development Fund.

The project, which was officially launched at Blackburn College, will create low-carbon skills centres across Lancashire, providing significant investment in cutting-edge technologies and upskilling teachers to ensure that courses meet the needs of employers and the industry.

The skills centres will support the Government's commitment to withdrawing the sale of new petro or diesel cars in 2030 as part of the UK's net-zero targets.



More than 600 students celebrate their success at Blackburn University Centre's graduation

Hundreds of students donned gaps and gowns as they turned out for Blackburn University Centre's 2020 and 2021 graduation ceremonies.

Around 600 students turned out to celebrate their successes at three graduation ceremonies held at King George's Hall.

Two ceremonies were held for students graduating in 2021, while a special graduation ceremony was held for students from 2020 as their graduation was postponed due to Covid-19. Drummers began the procession which started at the University Centre, led by college university partners from Lancaster University, the University of Central Lancashire and the University of South Wales.

The College's Leadership Team and Corporation Board were also in attendance along with the Mayor of Blackburn, Councillor Derek Hardman, and Mayoress Colette Hardman.





The Covid-19 pandemic has seen national reductions in student satisfaction with their universities throughout England, whilst Blackburn University Centre continues to be recognised for Overall Student Satisfaction and in all the categories used to assess the Student Experience.

Students have rated their Satisfaction with "the Teaching on my course" 5% higher than the sector average and the College's results exceed the national rate in the categories of "Teaching, Learning Opportunities, Assessment and Feedback, Academic Support and Organisation and Management" - all categories used to assess the student experience.

Inspirational Blackburn College student Daljeet Sachdeva has been volunteering and giving back to the community during lockdown.

Originally from Afghanistan, Daljeet is an Asylum Seeker who currently studies the College's English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) course. In her spare time, she has been doing amazing voluntary work for charity YMCA Blackburn.

Through YMCA, Daljeet has been distributing food parcels, organising and hosting educational activity Zoom calls for children, keeping the community informed via the YMCA platforms, giving talks in schools and leading an International Women's Day online event.

Daljeet, 21, said: "When I arrived in Blackburn I felt quite helpless because it was a new place for me and there was no one in the town who could help me with my paperwork. I went to YMCA for help and after a while they asked me if I would like to join as a volunteer — I went home to think about it and said yes the next day. I have learned new things and I feel YMCA is the best place — I have been volunteering there for two years."

"I always remember my Dad's advice — he would say 'Daljeet, no matter how cruel the world is, always try to do good work and help everyone'."

Looking Ahead to 2022



Blackburn College's historic Victoria Building will undergo a redevelopment in 2022 using a Government grant.

This investment forms part of the Government's £1.5bn Further Education Capital Transformation Fund and Blackburn College is one of 16 institutions across the UK to receive a share of the funding.

The college's Victoria Building will be completely re-developed as part of a project to ensure the building and facilities support the skills needs of the local labour market and can contribute to local economic regeneration and the levelling-up of skills.

Principal and Chief Executive, Dr Fazal Dad, said: "Blackburn College is delighted with the allocation through phase two of the Further Education Capital Transformation Fund to re-develop the College's iconic Victoria Building, which first opened as Blackburn Technical School.

"The College is excited and the investment is extremely welcomed to support the College's outstanding student performance."

The College's exciting plans include the complete refurbishment of the listed building and the redevelopment of the current creative arts studios.

The redeveloped building will also include a training suite for adults and spaces for employers and community education including dedicated facilities for ESOL (English Speakers of Other Languages) students.

In the technical area of study, Motor Vehicle are embarking on a new £1.3m motor vehicle project which will bridge the skills gap in low-carbon vehicle mechanics. We are leading the Lancashire Automotive Skills Accelerator Project funded by the Department for Education, as part of The Skills Accelerator Strategic Development Fund. Our Regional Automotive Technology Hub (RATH) will focus on Electric and Hybrid vehicle maintenance, service and repair. We are dedicated in developing our offering and meeting the skills needed for future industries.

Blackburn Sixth Form students will now benefit from a new partnership between Blackburn Sixth Form and the University of Oxford, the University of Cambridge and other Russell Group universities with the launch of the OxNet programme.

Blackburn College will become a central hub for the prestigious programme which will help provide students with information and advice for applying to Oxbridge and Russell Group universities.

The OxNet programme is an intensive 12-month academic programme for year 12 pupils living in the North West, North East and London, which leads to a residential at Pembroke College at the University of Oxford. The course involves a mixture of study days, essays, series, Easter conferences, summer schools and talks.






Student Population by Gender, Ethnicity and Age
